The State Street Traditional Jazz Band of Portland has been playing and preserving the “rousing” music of New Orleans since 1989. The music they play is over 100 years old and represents the origins of jazz whose roots come directly from the French Quarter of New Orleans. This band performs familiar early jazz songs, blues numbers and old New Orleans spirituals.

Favorites from this era played by the State Street Traditional Jazz Band include: *When the Saints Go Marching In*, *Has anybody Seen My Gal*, *Saint Louis Blues*, and over 150 other songs in their musical repertoire from that time period.

This is not “Dixieland” nor is it “Straw Hat” music - this is the REAL DEAL. It doesn't get any better than this. Outside of dedicated portions of New Orleans and only a few select jazz festivals worldwide, you will not hear this music, which is now considered a living “art form” played. This music fills one’s soul with joy and spans the full spectrum of age from 8 to 80, it is an unparalleled musical experience.

The true origin of the decorated parasol was never really documented, but the common sense of necessity combined with the rigors of a stroll through the French Quarter or older neighborhoods of New Orleans before air conditioning hit

the city makes it easy to figure out. The idea of carrying an umbrella for shade was very common and it was also a symbol of southern style, femininity and grace. This umbrella became an accessory of choice for many southern weddings and was often an indicator of societal statue. Second Line Umbrellas now reflect attitude and personal style as they twirl and spin as if to say “laissez les bons temps rouler” (let the good times roll)!

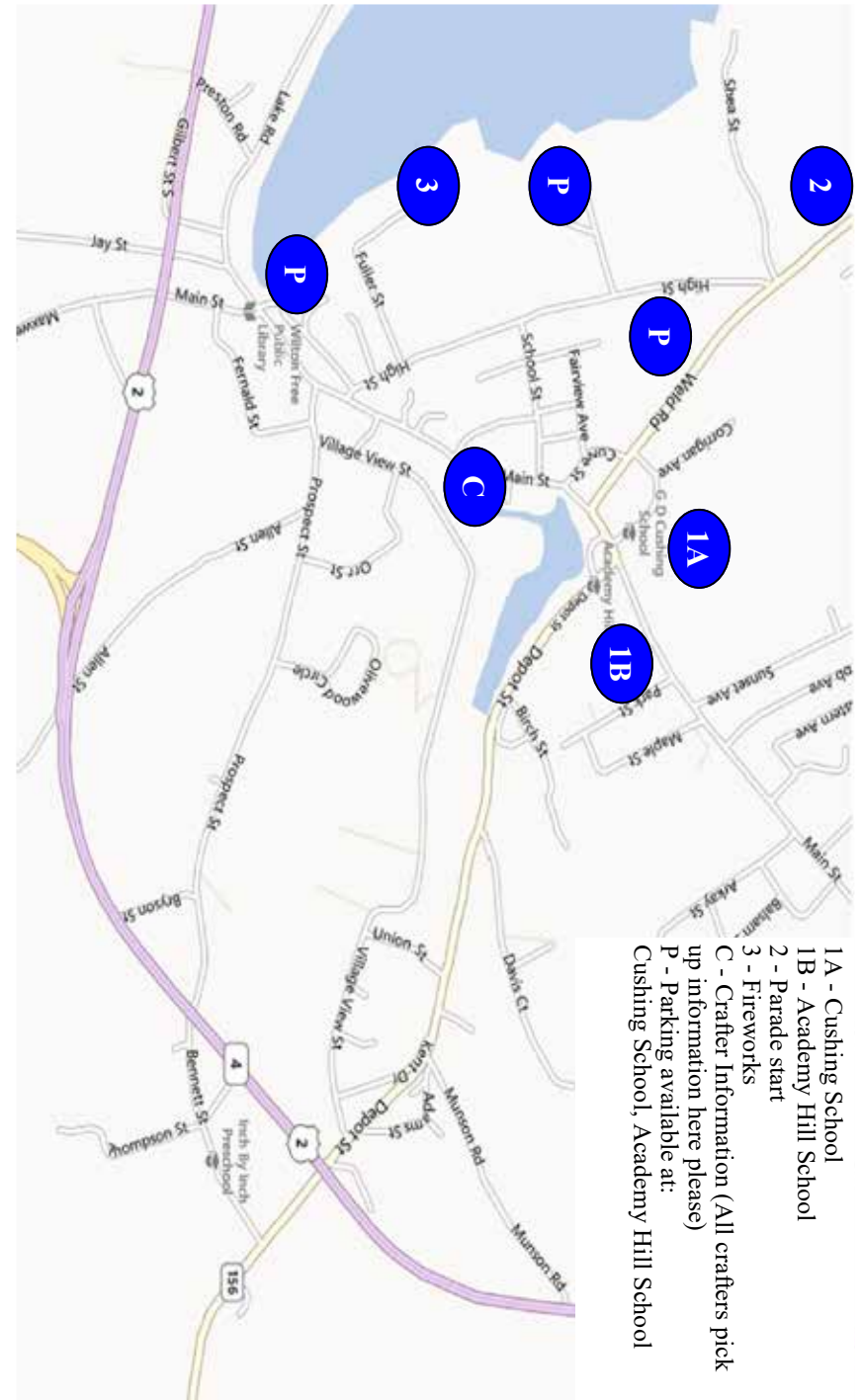
